2500 KM to Meditate!

The adventure of a 28-years old Québécois to help the opening of the Open Centre, a UNESCO-supported project

(Montreal, May 14th, 2007) - Benoit Martin, from the South Shore of Montreal, is about to set on a 2500 km tour on his bicycle to collect funds for the opening of a meditation center named *Open Centre* in Spain. This adventure is to raise funds: 1 euro per kilometer cycled, for a total of 2500 Euros (approximately \$3800 CAN). The collected funds will go directly to the *Open Centre*, to allow for the purchase of the land for this project.

The trip will start in Leipzig, Germany, in the beginning of June and will end in mid-August in front of the *Open Centre*, located in the region of Catalonia, north of Barcelona. Benoit Martin will pass through a total of 5 countries: Germany, Switzerland, Liechtenstein, France and Spain. He will also cross the Alps and the Pyrenees, ascending 3 times up to an altitude of 2000 meters (6500 feet). With his laptop computer and his digital camera, powered by a solar panel, the whole world can witness Benoit Martin's **philanthropic adventure** through the official 2500 KM to Meditate website: www.2500km.com

UNESCO is supporting the opening of the *Open Centre* and has recently launched a campaign through out Catalonia to get the support of 50 spiritual/religious groups for the project. This generous support is essential for the creation of the Open Centre.

Facilities of a previous meditation centre, able to accommodate 40 people, along with 2 meditation halls accommodating up to 225 people are already existing and are in excellent condition. The actual owner of the location, a retired spiritual teacher, was not intending to sell his property until hearing about the *Open Centre* project. *Open Dharma*, the non-profit organization which is supporting the *Open Centre*, includes Jaya Julienne Ashmore, Gemma Polo Pujol and Ajay Pal Singh, 3 meditation teachers coming respectively from the United States, Spain and India.

Thus, no construction or restoration work is needed for the opening of the Open Centre, and the funds collected by Benoit Martin will go entirely to the purchase of the location and the installations, which cost approximately 900 000 Euros (1.5 millions \$ CAN). The *Open Centre* has a great location, in the nature, surrounded by cliffs which are inspiring silence and tranquility. The facilities include 150 acres of lush forest, which will allow to hold different programs simultaneously without compromising silence or preventing laughter.

The fund-raising event organized by Benoit Martin is only one among so many. Many people around the world are working for the creation of the *Open Centre*.

Their visit in Québec

In June 2006, Benoit and friends organized a meditation retreat for *Open Dharma* in Mauricie, Québec.

Over the years, rich from the experience of more than a hundred retreats organized throughout the world, *Open Dharma* saw that there is a real need for a place like the *Open Centre*. There is a great hunger for a sense of belonging, for deep encounters with nature, silence, beauty, other people, and oneself, and for re-discovering what really matters in this life.

How to participate to this adventure?
